## **JOBS**

Write as many jobs as you can in the three columns.

Possible answers are provided below. There are probably more. Students need not note them all.

## Then discuss these questions:

- 1. Can you think of any jobs that <u>don't</u> end with *-er*, *-or*, *-ist* or *-ian*? Answers: *architect, businessman/woman, cook, mechanic, pilot, salesperson, secretary* and others
- 2. Where do the words come from? For example, *teacher* comes from *teach*.

Answer: Many in the *er/or* column come from verbs: *bake, farm, manage*, etc. In the other two columns, there is a connection to nouns, e.g. *biology* and *beauty*.

3. Are any of these words similar to French? Are the endings similar? Answer: Yes, there are many cognates. See the list of French equivalents on the next page. Note that many in the *-er/-or* column have *-eur* endings in French. Many in the *-ist* column have *-iste* endings in French. And many of the *-ian* words end in *-ien* in French.

Note: A difference between English and French: There are grammaticalized feminine versions for some of these French endings. English used to have some of this too, but now many people avoid gendered forms in English, opting for *actor* and *salesperson* instead of *actress* and *salesman*.
